## PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

#### 1. Staff Employees of the Month

Full-time Staff Employees of the Month for October 2013 and November 2013 were Carmelita Boyer, Administrative Assistant, Human Resources and Darla Van Horn, Deputy Title IX and Compliance Officer, Student Enrollment Services respectively.

Part-time Staff Employees of the Month for September 2013 and October 2013 were Brian Van Horn, Media Technician, Communication Technologies and PC Services and Mark Sommer, Academic Assistant, Athletic and College Recreation respectively.

#### 2. Governmental and Financial Affairs

- Capital Bill the Governor has appointed a Funding Task Force with three community college and four university presidents. Dr. Harrison has been assigned to this Task Force. Each college and university was required to submit a six year plan. Columbus State focused on technology and deferred maintenance emphasizing our leadership in on-line technology based learning and ensuring sustainable infrastructure.
- Dual Enrollment/College Credit Plus the Chancellor requested that a group of four community college presidents, including Dr. Harrison, submit recommendations on completion, success and affordability strategies.
- Ohio College Opportunity Grant (OCOG) this grant provides resources for the neediest students in the State of Ohio. Unfortunately, community college students are exempt from this grant. The presidents are working diligently together to have the community college students included.

• SSI Funding Formula – it appears the general model will be:

o Course Completion: 50%

o Success Points: 25%

o Completion Milestone: 25%

o Access Categories: adult, low income, minority

The course completion and the completion milestone will also have a cost basis, and so courses and programs that have a higher cost will have a higher subsidy attached. Success points are distributed by success in developmental education, moving to college-level course work.

- Enrollment the College is working to identify which students have applied but not enrolled; why they haven't enrolled; and how the College can work in more methodical way to assess and register students.
- Pepsi Contract to Fund Scholarships with our Pepsi contract, we received a one-time payout of \$75,000 which will be allocated towards scholarships.

## 3. 2013 AQIP/Systems Portfolio Committees

The 2013 Columbus State AQIP/Systems Portfolio was distributed Board members. Dr. Harrison acknowledged and thanked the core team and portfolio committees for their excellent work.

#### 4. Miami University Partnership

Columbus State executed a Partnership Agreement with Miami University on October 4, 2013. For Fall 2013 and Spring 2014, full-time Columbus State students admitted to Miami University's Oxford campus as new, full-time transfer students will be considered for merit based transfer scholarships that range from \$1,500 - \$7,500 per year.

#### 5. AEP Credits Count Grant

AEP has awarded Columbus State \$5 million dollars over the next 5 years to launch STEM dual enrollment in Columbus City Schools. The first school is West High School with four additional schools to be named. The grant emphasizes dual enrollment, job skills, and technical credentials.

#### 6. High School Senior Visit Day

On October 18, 2013, Columbus State held a high school senior visit day that was very well attended. Dr. Harrison thanked Mabel Freeman and Martin Maliwesky for their outstanding work with their staff and the significant turn-out. A similar event is being planned for the Delaware campus.

#### 7. OBR Trustee Conference

Columbus State hosted the OBR Trustee conference on October 21, 2013. This is the second year that we have hosted this event. It is a good way to showcase the College.

#### 8. Pathways to Prosperity

Columbus State hosted Jobs for the Future from Boston, along with OBR and 70 Compact partners on November 6, 2013. Emphasis was on the state dual enrollment policy with a focus on technical credentials.

# 9. Leverage 50th Anniversary

Due to the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary activities, Dr. Harrison stated that we elevated the profile of Columbus State to the communities we serve; highlighted community outreach, engagement and partnerships; fostered faculty, staff and student engagement; and foreshadowed the College's re-branding campaign.

#### 10. State of Columbus State

Columbus State hosted more than 150 local business leaders, civic and public officials and unveiled the Master Plan.

#### 11. College Day of Service

More than 650 Columbus State volunteers participated in a day of service. This organized day impacted 34 community organizations. There was a great response from employees and many would like to have this as an annual event.

#### 12. 50th Birthday Party Celebration

This event showcased student engagement and talent. As a part of this event, the Student Engagement and Leadership (SEaL) team delivered more than 300 pounds of donated food items to the Mid-Ohio Food Bank. Activities also included a student talent show, culinary student baking competition, and a flash mob.

### 13. Columbus State Day

This was the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary gift to the community that showcased faculty and `offered more than 80 classes and demonstrations. We welcomed approximately 700 community members and families to our campus.
