JOURNAL NAME

DESCRIPTION

<i>American Literary History</i>	Covers the study of U.S. literature from its origins through the present, providing a forum for the voices of contemporary literary inquiry.
<i>American Literary Scholarship</i>	Features bibliographic essays arranged by writer and time period, from pre-1800 to the present.
<i>American Literature</i>	Covers the works of American authors, from colonial to contemporary; extensive book review section.
<i>American Speech</i>	Focuses on the English language and linguistic theory, as well as issues outside of the linguistic studies community.
<i>Callaloo</i>	An African Diaspora literary journal; publishes original works by, and critical studies of, black writers worldwide.
<i>Camera Obscura</i>	Provides innovative feminist perspectives on film, television, and visual media.
<i>Comparative Literature Studies</i>	Covers traditions of Africa, Europe, and the Americas; examines literary relations between Asia and the West.
<i>Contemporary Literature</i>	In-depth interviews with significant writers, articles by leaders in the field, and book reviews of critical studies.
<i>Critical Quarterly</i>	A unique blend of literary criticism, cultural studies, poetry and fiction.
<i>Discourse</i>	Essays on a wide range of cultural phenomena, promoting theoretical approaches to literature, film, the visual arts, and related media.

<i>Early American Literature</i>	Publishes the work of scholars examining American literature from its inception through the early national period, about 1830; includes Native American traditions.
<i>The Emily Dickinson Journal</i>	Provides an ongoing examination of Dickinson and her relation to American poetry and women's literature.
<i>The Hemingway Review</i>	Specializes in feature-length scholarly articles on the work and life of Ernest Hemingway; includes notes, book reviews, and current bibliography.
<i>The Henry James Review</i>	Critical essays and reviews by new as well as established scholars of Henry James.
<i>Hispanic Review</i>	Devoted to research in Hispanic literary and cultural studies, featuring essays and reviews on Spanish and Latin American culture, from medieval to present.
<i>Journal of Arabic Literature</i>	Provides scholarly essays on themes and texts in Arabic literature.
<i>Journal of Modern Literature</i>	Addresses all literature written in the 20 th & 21 st centuries, as well as literature other than English and American.
<i>The Journal of Popular Culture</i>	Breaks down the barriers between so-called "low" and "high" culture; focuses on filling in the gaps a neglect of popular culture has left in our understanding of the workings of society.
<i>Legacy</i>	The only journal to focus specifically on American women's writings from the 17 th through the mid-20 th century; race, ethnicity, class, and sexuality issues among those explored.
<i>Manoa</i>	Includes American and international fiction, poetry, artwork, and essays of current cultural or literary interest; Asian and Pacific nations featured.
<i>MFS Modern Fiction Studies</i>	Publishes articles on prominent works of modern and contemporary fiction, emphasizing historical, theoretical, and interdisciplinary approaches; encourages a dialogue between fiction and theory.
<i>The Missouri Review</i>	Each issue contains new fiction, poetry, and essays; also includes interviews with current authors.
<i>Prooftexts</i>	Dedicated to the study of Jewish literature, including essays by Americans and Israelis.
<i>Theatre Journal</i>	Scholarly articles and reviews of dramatic texts and productions.
