SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

Student and Employee Visionary Dreamer Awards

Every year in celebration of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., the college honors one staff member and one student for their leadership and commitment to creating a diverse campus culture. Originally called The Visionary Dreamer Award, the honor was renamed in recent years to reflect two members of our community who exemplified the important work of Dr. King, Barbara Smith-Allen and Darius Torrence.

Awardees make a significant and lasting contribution in creating an environment where diversity is honored and respected on campus and within the broader community.

George Floyd Memorial Scholarship

This scholarship, created in memory of George Floyd, is a merit-based award given to students who demonstrate leadership, social justice work, and activism that furthers progress in their community.

2025 Napoleon Bell Sr. Award

This award is presented annually to one Columbus State employee and one Columbus State student who demonstrate ambition, persistence, integrity, service, and support of Columbus State values – qualities embodied by the award's namesake.

The Bell Award was created in honor of Napoleon Arthur Bell Sr., a prestigious attorney, and a giving community leader, who also served as Chairman of the Board at Columbus State from 1992-1994 and was a Trustee for many years.


The Black National Anthem LIFT EVERY VOICE AND SING
